August 3, 2018 Eastpoint Limerock Wildfire Press Release

On 06/24/18 the Eastpoint Limerock Wildfire burned 36 Homes with an estimated 1.7 Million Dollars in damages.

The following Actions have been taken by Franklin County including the Franklin County Emergency Management office:

- A Local State of Emergency was signed on 06/24/18 at 8:24 PM.
- All residents requiring a power pole, the exception being 588 Ridge Road who has
 chosen not to remove the debris from the lot, have received a power pole and it has been
 installed. Power Poles were installed by Cates Electric and meters have been installed by
 Duke Energy
- Duke Energy does not require connection fees for reconnecting all the power poles that were impacted by the fire. Power poles were purchased with donations received by Franklin County Emergency Management/Franklin's Promise.
- Eastpoint Water and Sewer & Varner Plumbing are working together to get all temporary housing connected to Water and Sewer. Assistance with Fees for reconnecting Water & Sewer are available through Franklin County Emergency Management/Franklin's Promise Donations that have been received.
- All debris was removed by 07/11/18 by volunteer contractors (Roberts and Roberts, Jason White, Coastline, The City of Tallahassee, and Sapp Brothers Logging). Franklin County Road Department assisted with the removal of debris. Franklin County Board of County Commissioners and Franklin County Solid Waste waived all tipping fees.
- All 24 temporary housing trailers have arrived and were staged on the Franklin County School Board Property on Hwy 65 in Eastpoint. These temporary housing trailers were purchased by Franklin County Board of County Commissioners from the Government Surplus Auction. Capital Area Community Action has purchased the 24 Temporary Housing Trailers from the Franklin County Board of County Commissioners to assist Franklin County in providing housing for residents who were impacted. These 24 Temporary Housing Trailers are being loaned to survivors for a period of 6 months to allow time for Permanent Housing solutions.
- Temporary Housing Trailers are being stocked with move in kits which include sheets, pillows, pillow cases, blankets, towels, dishes, silverware, coffee pot, glasses, laundry basket, broom, mop, cleaning supplies, garbage cans, etc. The Move-In-Kits are from the

- donations received and have been prepared by Ms. Tamera Allen and volunteers at the Donations Receiving Center located at the Carrabelle City Hall Complex.
- The City of Carrabelle has graciously donated space at the Carrabelle City Hall Complex on Gray Avenue in Carrabelle. This Donations Receiving Center has allowed Franklin County Emergency Management/Franklin's Promise Coalition the ability to store the extremely large amount of donations that have been received. With this space volunteers were able to sort and organize the donations.
- All impacted residents are on the list for our long-term recovery plan.
- Franklin County Planning and Zoning & Franklin County Board of County Commissioners have waived all possible local permitting fees to assist impacted residents.
- Federal and State fees cannot be waived for permitting. Assistance with these fees are available through the Franklin County Emergency Management/Franklin's Promise Donations that have been received.
- Temporary Housing Trailers are being delivered to home sites. 15 Trailers have been delivered and set up.
- All property sites are currently being prepared for Temporary Housing Trailer delivery.
- Eastpoint Church of God so graciously set up as our Temporary Shelter and received food donations during the Response Phase of this fire.
- Tom Williams with the Salvation Army provided the Canteen and cleaning supplies for 2 weeks following the fire. Over 2000 meals were prepared and delivered through the Salvation Army Canteen.
- 2 Tractor Trailers are being used to store donations at the Eastpoint Fire House. These trailers were graciously donated by Peggy Miller and Mike and Paige Richards.
- Donations are being loaded at the Carrabelle Donation Receiving Center and delivered to the impacted residents regularly by Franklin County Emergency Management and Franklin's Promise.
- A Long-Term Recovery Meeting took place on 08/02/18 to discuss options for permanent housing for the Eastpoint Fire Victims.
- The Back to School Bash is being held at Brown Elementary, 85 School Road Eastpoint, on 08/03/18 from 3:00-6:00 PM to assist Eastpoint Fire Survivors with obtaining necessary supplies and clothing for students returning to school.
- The Williams Family Foundation of Georgie has provided a \$25,000 challenge grant for long term housing strategies. Every dollar donated is matched one to one up to \$25,000.
- All 77 students impacted by the fire have been provided back to school clothes and a backpack with supplies thanks to volunteers, donors and area churches.

We are asking that anyone who was an unauthorized secondary resident and your home was destroyed to please contact Franklin County Emergency Management to discuss your options for temporary housing assistance.

Due to the extremely heartwarming volume of donations received, we are no longer accepting donations other than monetary at this time. Commissioners: My report is coming to you early this month in order to provide you with results of the review of Vendor RFQs.

Collections:

As of the preparation of this report, we had not received the July collection numbers. If they come in before your meeting, I will add them to my report.

Vendor RFQs:

The TDC Board has reviewed the responses to the Vendor RFQs for the four vendor categories including: Print Media, Internet, TV Airtime and Production and Local radio. I have attached a report on the ranking for each of these categories and we submit them to you for consideration.

Non-profit Grant Program:

The TDC is in the process of reviewing the 2018-19 grant applications described in the information I provided you at your June meeting. As we expected there were a number of issues raised by applicants that the TDC will be trying to resolve as review of the programs continue. Tomorrow (Wednesday August 8) the TDC Board will be discussing the Museum Grant program in an attempt to address a number of their concerns.

Members of the TDC Grant Committee met last week to determine completeness of the other grant programs. During that discussion they forwarded several recommendations for consideration at tomorrow's TDC Board meeting. I have attached a copy of the minutes of that meeting and those recommendations for your information. There are four (4) issues about which the Committee has recommended clarifications:

- The applications require that organizations must either be a government organization or a 501C3 corporation. The Committee recommends that the wording be revised to read 501C organizations. This change corrects a typo to allow Chambers to apply for grants which was always the intention.
- Provide an opportunity to allow applicants two additional weeks to provide additional information.
- Amends the Match requirement to allow organizations to match their grants with funds budgeted for the event as opposed to just finds to be used for promotion. This change would be only for one year while organizations became familiar with the new grant requirements.
- Limited applications for an organization to one per event.

Board Appointment:

We have received the resignation of Board member Chester Reese who was serving as the designee from the Carrabelle Chamber. The Chamber has recommended Rob Prowis as a replacement for Mr. Reese. The Commission would need to approve the appointment.

The Vendor RFQ process is designed to provide a mechanism to solicit information from entities interested in serving as contractors that focuses on the qualifications of proponents without regard to a consideration of cost. Once applicants are ranked, the top ranked organization will enter into contract negotiations with the County to determine compensation.

Each Board member ranked the RFQ proposals prior to meeting; An opportunity will be given for members to ask questions of applicants and make modifications to their ranking prior to a final vote. After each category has been scored, the rankings will be turned in and totaled by Ms. Davis. At the conclusion the members can make additional comments and the ranking results will be announced. Scoring criteria ranking is based on ability to perform required services and also references. The highest possible score is 700 (100 x # of voting Board Members in attendance).

A discussion regarding conflict of interest was reviewed, and the eligibility of Commission Sanders to vote due to her relationship with 2KWeb Group. It was determined that the conflict of interest does not extend to nephews.

Discussion occurred regarding prohibition in the RFQ against applicants contacting members of the TDC Board or the Board of County Commissioners during the process. Board members reported that no such contact had been made.

Additional Comment for clarification by Brenda LaPaz: A list of the grants that receive final approval will be sent to the County Commission.

III - Application Completeness Review: Curt Blair

Mr. Blair reviewed the grant process and explained the basis for a number of provisions in the grant applications. He reminded the Committee and those in attendance that the Museum Grants would not be reviewed at this meeting since the TDC has scheduled a discussion for Museums at the August 8 TDC Board meeting.

Mr. Blair explained that the TDC was committed to getting grants reviewed by September in order that non-profits would be able to receive continuous funding into the new fiscal year. All of these discussions are subject to final approval of the TDC Budget by the Board of County Commissioners. He explained to those in attendance that the TDC had increase the number of possible grants from 37 grants in the current year to a minimum of 49 grants for the coming year with an addition of \$33,000 allocated to the new grant program year. He also explained that a number of the new provisions in the grant program were as a result of new transparency and accountability requirements imposed on TDCs by the 2018 Florida Legislature. He explained

that the BOCC and TDC Board were both requiring a match by local organizations requesting funds, that funds should be used primarily for promotion, that all applicants were required to be either governmental organizations or 501C organizations.

501C Corporations:

At the beginning of discussion Mr. Blair told the Committee that a typo existed in the grants applications that stated applicants must either be a governmental organization or a 501C3 corporation. He suggested that the Committee revise the 501C3 requirement to read: 501C corporations. This change would allow Chambers of Commerce which are 501C6 corporations to apply for grants which had always been the intent.

Motion: To change the 501c3 wording to 501c as explained.

Motion: Hewitt Second: LaPaz Passed

Financial Information Requirement:

John Solomon requested that the submission of financials was cumbersome and asked that the requirement for financials be adjusted to refer to financials for the specific event and not the sponsoring organization. Committee members commented that financials and Federal 990 forms were necessary for a variety of reasons including to insure that the organization was solvent and that the required match could be insured. made comment/ multiple events are not meant to make money.

After discussion the Committee agreed not to change the financial and 990 requirement.

Additional Time:

Following discussion about financials, members of the public and Committee discussed the idea of granting non-profits additional time to get all of the information in the application submitted.

Motion: To allow non-profits two (2) additional weeks (to August 8) to update their applications based on results of the discussion at this meeting.

Motion: Reese Second: Hewitt Passed

Application Completeness:

Staff reviewed a spreadsheet provided Committee members that identified the key application requirements and noted whether applications met the requirements.

Non-profit Organizations:

Two organizations were determined not to be 501C corporations and one organization was determined to have let their 990 filing requirement lapse. These applicants were granted the two week period to update their information or affiliate with another non-profit organization that can meet the non-profit requirement.

Budgets:

Some applications were determined not to have completed the event budget requirement and were given additional time to submit the information.

Multiple Applications for the Same Event:

One series of applications were for multiple activities within the same event.

Motion: Only one application will be accepted for a major event. Events within events are not

acceptable

Motion : Pennycuff. Second: LaPaz. Passed

Match:

Some applicants expressed concern that requiring that match be provided with an equal amount of funds expended for promotion created a problem for a number of small organizations with limited funds.

Motion: To allow organizations to document match with the organization's overall budget, as opposed with providing an equal amount of promotion dollars to match the grant amount, for a period of one year.

Motion: Pennycuff. Second: LaPaz. Passed with 2opposed

Commissioners: The following information is provided as a supplement to the report distributed in your earlier package for Tuesday's meeting.

Collections:

Collections numbers for the month of May were \$140,130.14. This is an increase of \$29,645 over the previous year and results in an increase over last year's collections of 5.4% to date.

Visitor Center Visits:

We saw 3,304 visitors in our Centers in July. So far this year the Centers have seen a total of 23,622 visitors.

Web Traffic:

We have launched several internet advertising campaigns directed at empty nesters and snow birds. Our web activity was up over 74% in July as compared to July a year ago. We attribute this increase in part to the new web site that went on line a couple of months ago as well as the digital campaigns I just mentioned.

Our Social Media channels received 133,000 impressions and 1,735 engagements in July. We now have 91,197 social media followers.

Newsletter:

As I mentioned before a key function of our monthly promotional activities is our newsletter distribution. These publications are distributed to the email addresses we harvest through our Visitor Centers and non-profit organizations. In July we exceeded 50,000 qualified email

contacts that now receive our monthly newsletter that focuses on events and happenings throughout the county as well as future events and specials for the returning visitor.

VRBO and Tax Collection:

Finally, we are conducting a study of VRBO listings in Franklin County. By September we expect to know the actually number of VRBO listings that are likely not paying the required Tourist and Sales Tax.




How are site sessions trending?

Last 30 days vs. previous year




What are the top cities by sessions?



RESTORE Coordinator Report August 7, 2018

- 1- Alligator Point Road update- Dewberry Engineers have continued to meet with state and federal agencies regarding the Alligator Point Road. At this time, 4 separate permits are being requested by the various agencies- an FDEP stormwater permit, an FDEP road construction permit for building seaward of the Coastal Construction Control Line; an FDEP permit for coastal armoring seaward of the Coastal Construction Control Line and below Mean High Water, and a USACOE permit for coastal armoring below Mean High Water. The last two permits are a function of the county installing vertical sheetpile to protect the road. Each permit has its own review process.
- 2- Consortium update- The consultants for the Consortium sent out an email saying the Governor submitted the State Expenditure Plan (SEP) to the Gulf Council for review on July 27. The Council can take up to 60 days for a review. The consultants are hoping to have an update on the SEP at the next Consortium meeting, but they are not sure if that will happen. The SEP does include all of the county's projects- building a new EOC, dredging Eastpoint and Two Mile Channels, and funds for an oyster recovery project.
- 3- TRIUMPH update- The TRIUMPH staff continues to go through the backlog of submitted projects, but there is no timeline for when staff recommendations will come out. I have talked to staff and I hope that the county will hear about its Armory application at either the August or September meeting. I did not ask about the status of the city or school board projects, but they are also in the review process.

TRIUMPH staff is also still developing an oyster recovery project that would be funded with TRIUMPH funds. One of the components that still need to be worked out is the connection between TRIUMPH funds and the creation/retention of jobs. As the Board is aware, TRIUMPH is all about economic development. In order for TRIUMPH funds to be spent, and to avoid a clawback situation, TRIUMPH has to be satisfied of the number of jobs that are going to be created if TRIUMPH funds are provided. FSU, the Univ. of Florida, and representatives of the oyster industry have been meeting to put together an oyster recovery plan. The TRIUMPH staff is aware that Franklin County has requested SEP funds for an oyster recovery project, so it is possible that those two funding sources would be used for one project. The Board would have to agree to that before it would happen.

4- RESTORE update- As the Board is aware, we have held up developing our plan to use the RESTORE funds until we saw what was going to be funded by TRIUMPH. The cities are in agreement with this strategy, because if projects were not funded by TRIUMPH, but still had public value, then it is possible the projects could be funded through RESTORE. The county had a Planning Grant from US Treasury to pay for the development of the MYIP (the MYIP is essentially a list of projects to be funded by RESTORE and Treasury has to approve the MYIP). The county had selected Dewberry Engineers to assist in the MYIP development.

I have had several conversations with Treasury staff over the months that we have been working on TRIUMPH projects on when the county would get back to RESTORE.

Because there was no timeline for TRIUMPH I could not give Treasury a timeline. Consequently, Treasury has decided that it will not issue an extension to our Planning Grant, which expired July 31, 2018. The expiration of our Planning Gant means that the county does not have the funds to continue to pay Dewberry for any more work on the MYIP. I had put Dewberry on hold when we started working on TRIUMPH. We had a \$350K contract with them and paid them about \$150K for the work they did. Planning Grant funds that are not used will still be available to the county, either in the form of another Planning Grant, or in the form of construction funds if in fact we don't need \$200K to finish the MYIP. Since Treasury has become more efficient in its guidance I am estimating that it will take no more than \$50K in planning effort to finish the MYIP, so the county is ahead by letting the Planning Grant expire.

My continued recommendation to the Board is that we finish the TRIUMPH process and see where we stand with projects before we re-start the MYIP process. In order for all our governmental entities to have time to get responses from TRIUMPH I recommend the Board re-visit the MYIP in January.

I have discussed the Dewberry contract with Mr. Shuler. The contract allows the county to cancel with 30 days notice, but Dewberry has not been doing any work on the contract in at least 6 months. I have sent Dewberry a notice of cancellation and have copied Mr. Shuler.

5- Eastpoint Fire Update on Long Term Housing- The Board is aware that the short term housing problems for the Eastpoint Fire victims are currently being worked on. On Thursday, August 2, 20 representatives of state and local agencies met in the Franklin County Courthouse to discuss permanent solutions for the housing lost during the Eastpoint Fire.

This report is a brief summary of that meeting. The meeting lasted 2 hours and ranged over many topics. The main funding available for long term housing are CDBG funds. The state is working on an application on behalf of Franklin County to secure additional CDBG funds from the federal government. Debbie Belcher, Franklin County CDBG grant administrator, and Tress Dameron, Franklin County EOC, were assigned the responsibility of reconciling the various lists of displaced persons. The goal of this effort will be to determine how many of the displaced households are eligible for housing through CDBG. Once the number of eligible households is known Ms. Belcher will work with the DEO representatives to complete an application for CDBG funds for replacement housing. At this time, the main focus of the replacement housing will be mobile homes, but the group is aware that several on-site houses were also lost.

The Board will be the recipient of the CDBG funds, and would use Ms. Belcher to administer the funds. There are caps on how much of CDBG funds can be spent per unit, but until a conclusive list of eligible households is created it is unknown how much money the state will be able to secure from the federal CDBG program. Once that number is known Ms. Belcher will make it known to the Board. Ms. Belcher and Ms. Dameron will try to get the reconciled list of households to DEO in the next two weeks. So, the Board could have an update on long term housing from Ms. Belcher or Ms. Dameron in September.

While the state is assisting in securing additional CDBG funds for the county, many of the existing federal regulations regarding eligibility will still be in place so there will be some households that will not be eligible for CDBG funds. It appears that many of the fire victims will be eligible, but the Board needs to understand that other housing solutions are going to be needed. These other housing needs include those people who can't prove they owned or rented a structure destroyed by the fire, but can prove they were living in a structure destroyed by the fire, and those people who can prove they owned or rented a structure but whose income exceeds the guidelines set for CDBG housing assistance. There will be more discussions on how to get those non-CDBG households back on their feet, but it appears there is going to be need for charitable organizations to help these non-CDBG eligible households.

Cameron: Good morning! It has been months since we last spoke but the message in this email should not come as a surprise. As you know, Franklin County had a US Treasury Planning Grant to develop an MYIP, and Franklin County selected Dewberry to provide planning services to develop the MYIP. You and I agreed several months ago that you would stop working on the MYIP because the county wanted to pursue TRUMPH funds first. During the time the county has been working on TRIUMPH projects, the Treasury Planning Grant expired. It expired on July 31, 2018, and Treasury staff have notified me that they will not extend the grant. Franklin County can apply for another planning grant to complete the MYIP but Treasury wants a timeline and until we complete the TRIUMPH process I can not develop a timeline. Therefore, Franklin Couny is exercising the termination of the existing Dewberry contract. The contract allows the county to terminate the contract with or without cause with 30 days notice. With this email I am requesting Dewberry waive the formal 30 days notice requirement and accept this email as notice the contract is terminated, and that there are no outstanding bills related to the contract. I have copied Michael Shuler, County Attorney, on this email in the event he has some additional comments.

County Coordinator's Report BOCC Regular Meeting August 7, 2018

- 1. **Board action** to authorize the Chairman's signature on the Resolution and application for the removal of the derelict vessel in the Eastpoint channel. The grant amount is \$2,925 and the County's 25% match, which will be paid from the Boating Improvement Fund, is \$975 and brings the total project cost to \$3,900.
- 2. Mr. Clay Kennedy of Dewberry has finalized the change order to create a direct access to the Chapman Building from Highway 98 here in Apalachicola. As the Board is aware the Chapman Building is owned by the County however, we are basically land-locked because access to the building is either across property owned by the City of Apalachicola or the School District. The Change Order calls for the opening of 13th Street in front of the Chapman Building by Roberts and Roberts. In anticipation of starting this project, I was able to get the Sheriff's work crew to remove the fence in front of the building along Highway 98 and get Mr. Nabors to remove a tree base in that same area. This project will be paid from the Paving Fund Repair and Maintenance line item. *Board action* to authorize the Chairman's signature on the Change Order.
- 3. Inform the Board that Mr. Clay Kennedy of Dewberry has submitted the Northwest Florida Water Management District exemption and the Florida Department of Transportation Driveway Connection permit that will allow direct access to the Jail's lift station from Highway 65. As the Board may recall, it became necessary for the Sheriff to install additional security fencing at the Jail to reduce the introduction of contraband. The installation of this additional security fence interfered with access to the lift station. It was agreed at a previous meeting that the County would pay for the permit fees, Eastpoint Water and Sewer District will build the access road from Highway 65 to the lift station, and the Sheriff would install security fencing around the lift station when informed to by Eastpoint Water and Sewer District to do so. All necessary agencies are aware that staff has received the exemption and permit.
- 4. At the last meeting the Board made a motion to advertise for RFPs for County property and auto insurance along with engineering services. Mrs. Griffith, Assistant Finance Officer, thinks it is too close to the renewal date of October 1st for 2018-19 property and insurance coverage and recommends that the Board consider this advertisement during the Spring of 2019. Is the Board willing to amend the motion or defer this motion until next year? **Board discussion/action**.
- In order to close out the FRDAP grant that partially paid for the soccer field and basketball court at D W Wilson Park, the County needs to record a Notice of Site Dedication and Limitation of Use which dedicates the Park as a public outdoor

recreation area in perpetuity. **Board action** to authorize the Chairman's signature on this notice.

- 6. Mrs. Lisa Lance, your Library Director, recently advertised for two vacant full-time positions, one for the Eastpoint branch and the other for the Carrabelle branch. After reviewing the Carrabelle branch schedule, she decided to revert to two part-time positions so that she could adequately staff that branch for the six days they are open. She will keep the full-time position in Eastpoint. Mrs. Lance will contact all of the applicants and inform them of the change.
- 7. Ms. Lori Switzer, your SHIP Administrator, has informed me that as of September 30th there will be three vacancies on the County's Housing Board. All of the members on this Board have served for at least 11 years. Districts 1, 4, & 5 seats are or will be vacant by September 30th and Skip Frink (District 2) and Robert Davis (District 3) will remain on the Board. The Housing Board meets once a quarter and since Reverend John Sink's last day will be September 30th, you should have replacements in place no later than the second meeting in September.
- 8. Last week the Sheriff's Office notified staff that the deadline for submitting the application for the Edward Byrne Assistance Grant Program was August 3rd. It appears that this revised deadline was due to changes at the State level. I asked Attorney Shuler to review the application and accompanying documents before presenting them for the Chairman's signature. *Board action* to ratify the Chairman's signature on the application.
- 9. **Board action** to ratify the Chairman's signature on the the 2018/2019 Solid Waste Consolidated Grant Application. The grant is for \$90,909.00 and the application was due on August 1st.
- 10. Staff was notified by the National Forest Service in Florida of the availability of the Big Gully Analysis Area Environmental Assessment for 30 day notice and comment. The comment period began on July 25th and ends on August 24th. The project webpage could be found at: http://goo.gl/z9xQe0. ACTION ITEMS

1. Public Comment Policy

The proposed Public Comment policy is attached for consideration by the Board.

Board Action: I recommend that the Board adopt the policy as submitted or with such modifications as the Board directs.

2. ESF15 Contract

The ESF15 designation is given by Franklin County to the entity charged with managing donations and volunteers in the event of a disaster. It is the entity that the county informs the public to donate to for disaster relief.

On July 3, 2018, the Board directed that Franklin's Promise agree to certain parameters intended by the Board to provide for the public's trust in the transparency and accountability of the donations received by the county's ESF15 entity, Franklin's Promise Coalition, as a result of the Lime Rock wildfire of June 24, 2018.

The contract with the material terms that the Board approved is attached.

Franklin's Promise Coalition has been aware of this contract since prior to the July 3, 2018 meeting. As of August 2, 2018, the ESF15 entity, Franklin's Promise Coalition, has not signed the contract.

I am told that approximately \$287,000.00 has been raised to date and that approximately \$257,000.00 remains unspent.

Board Action: I recommend that the Board set a deadline of August 10, 2018, for Franklin's Promise Coalition to deliver a signed contract to Franklin County in a form and content approved by Franklin County. Board discussion of how to proceed if the contract is refused.

NON-ACTION ITEMS

3. Mike Cooper:

I am informed that the hospital will be making the first of six monthly installments the week ending August 3, 2018.

4. Pinki Jackel:

On July 3, 2018, I informed the Board that Dana Jackel called me and basically said that he agrees with me that no "offset" can be made for the over-payment, but that he would sue for the unpaid part of Pinki's 2015 salary, which is \$950 in rounded numbers. I've asked our auditor to provide input on this issue.

These are the facts:

F/Y ending 9-30-2015: \$949.71 underpayment F/Y ending 9-30.2016: \$1,481.21 overpayment F/Y ending 9-30-2017: \$1,896.24 overpayment

After consultation with the auditor and because the cost of litigating over \$950.00 is a poor use of public resources, the following resolution was reached after consultation with the Supervisor of Elections, the county's CPA and the Florida Retirement System ("FRS"): Pinki has paid \$2,427.99 to the Supervisor of Elections for the overpayment. We will deem that the parties have exchanged checks in the amount of \$950.00. The CPA will amend the appropriate Form 941 returns and issue corrected W2's. The Supervisor will notify FRS of all these adjustments and FRS which will make adjustments as it deems appropriate to the FRS contributions of the county and the payments made by FRS to Pinki.

PUBLIC COMMENT POLICY

The Chairman asked me to provide this information as a policy for the Board's consideration:

Florida Statute 286.0114(2) provides that members of the public shall be given reasonable opportunity to be heard on a proposition before the Franklin County Board of County Commissioners. The opportunity to be heard need not occur at the same meeting at which the board takes official action on the proposition if the opportunity occurs at a meeting that is during the decision-making process and is within a reasonable proximity in time before the meeting at which the board takes official action.

To facilitate public comment, the Agenda is to be completed by Thursday afternoon preceding the next meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, including all reports of the department heads, county coordinator and county attorney.

A notation should be added to the agenda and to the website stating that the public is invited to comment on the items on the agenda during the public comment portion of the agenda. This agenda will then be posted to the website the Friday before the next board meeting.

Florida Statute 286.0114(4)(d), authorizes Franklin County to designate a specified period of time for public comment: It is the policy of Franklin County that public comment on the agenda items is designated to occur immediately following the opening of the meeting. However, public comment during public hearings will occur when the public hearing is taken up on the agenda and not during public comment.

Members of the public who desire to be heard during public comment shall, at the time that the Chairman calls for public comment during the public comment portion of the agenda, raise their hand to indicate that they wish to be heard. Members of the public will be recognized by the Chairman and asked to come forward to the podium and speak. Alternatively, (or additionally) the Board could require that persons who wish to speak during public comment complete a speaker's card and deliver it to the Clerk of Court prior to the meeting at either 33 Market Street, Suite 203, Apalachicola, Florida or 34 Forbes Street, Apalachicola, Florida.

<u>Pursuant to 286.0114(4)(a), Franklin County is authorized to provide guidelines regarding the amount of time an individual has to address the board</u>: Franklin County adopts the following guideline for public comment:

- a. <u>Individuals:</u> the board adopts a guideline that public comment for individuals should be kept to no more than three minutes. The member of the public will approach the podium after being recognized by the Chairman and state their name. Members of the public may have someone else speak on their behalf if they wish.
- b. <u>Representatives</u>: Pursuant to 286.0114(4)(a)(b), the board adopts as a guideline that the public comment of representatives of groups or factions should be kept to no more than five minutes rather than all members of such groups or faction at meetings in which a large number of individuals wish to be heard. The designated representative of the group or faction will step to the podium after being recognized by the Chairman and state their name and the name of the group or faction on whose behalf they are speaking.

c. The Board is not required to respond to speakers during public comment period or during public hearings.

No action will be taken on non-agenda matters brought up during public comment. Rather, if the board desires to take action on a matter brought up during public comment, then the board will vote to have that matter placed on the agenda of a future meeting of the board.

Action by the board will be taken on agenda items at the time shown on the agenda, or as soon thereafter as possible.

Emergency action on matters not on the agenda that require board action which cannot be <u>deferred</u>: first, the board will amend the agenda to add the matter, then, call for public comment, followed by discussion of the board and staff before taking action.

During public hearings, such as the adoption of an ordinance, the public shall be allowed to comment prior to a vote being taken on the proposed ordinance.

Matters not on the agenda that are brought up by the Commissioners during a meeting shall be placed on a future agenda for action by the board, if a majority vote of the board approves.

During public hearings, public comment shall be subject to the above rules for individuals and representatives.

CONTRACT

WHEREAS, Franklin's Promise Coalition, Inc., a Florida not for profit corporation, ("Franklin's Promise") whose mailing address is P.O. Box 276, Apalachicola, Florida 32329, requested to be, and has been, designated as the Emergency Support Function 15 ("ESF 15"), by the Franklin County Emergency Management Department under the authority of Franklin County; and,

WHEREAS, one of the important functions of the ESF15 is that it is designated by Franklin County as the entity to collect and manage donations for recovery efforts during and after disasters; and,

WHEREAS, Franklin's Promise's designation as Franklin County's ESF15 is inherently a position of public trust and confidence, and carries with it fundamental obligations of transparency and accountability to Franklin County, and the public, for donations received in its capacity as the ESF15, as well as how those funds are spent; and,

WHEREAS, on June 24, 2018, an unprecedented wildfire disaster occurred in Eastpoint, Florida, in the neighborhood that borders along Ridge Road, Wilderness Road and Buck Street, known as the "Lime Rock Fire" ("Wildfire"); and,

WHEREAS, the wildfire destroyed approximately 36 homes and mobile homes, and also destroyed an additional 50-70 sheds that were being used a living quarters, and displaced up to 180 persons; and,

WHEREAS, on and after June 24, 2018, Franklin's Promise has held itself out to the public as the agency designated by Franklin County to receive donations for the recovery from the Wildfire; and,

WHEREAS, the donations received by the Franklin County's ESF15 are unprecedented in amount, approximately \$200,000.00 as of July 11, 2018,

WHEREAS, donations made to Franklin's Promise in its capacity as Franklin County's ESF15 functions for recovery from the Wildfire are held in trust for the public and shall be received, accounted for, and expended in a manner that is transparent, open and accountable to Franklin County and the public;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT AGREED between Franklin County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, and Franklin's Promise that:

- 1. All the foregoing recitals are incorporated herein and adopted by the parties.
- 2. In consideration of these mutual promises, and other valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged, Franklin's Promise agrees to all of the following:
 - a. Retroactive to June 24, 2018, all monetary donations received by Franklin's Promise for the Wildfire shall be deposited into a separate bank account at a FDIC insured bank located in Franklin County, Florida ("Special Account.").

No funds other than monetary donations for the Wildfire shall be deposited into this account.

- i. Franklin County shall be named as an additional entity authorized to have permanent unlimited access to the Special Account, including but not limited to the bank statements and account documents, for oversight and audit purposes, but will not be an account owner. The Special Account documents shall be structured in a manner approved by Franklin County, including, but not limited to a resolution on file with the banking institution that Franklin County's access to the Special Account cannot be cancelled without the prior written approval of Franklin County and that the Special Account cannot be closed without the prior written consent of Franklin County.
- b. All records of Franklin's Promise relating to its status and activities as ESF15 for Franklin County shall be public records, including, but not limited to the monetary and non-monetary donations for the Wildfire recovery.
- c. Written receipts including the name and, if possible, the address of the donor, and the amount of the donation, shall be made for all cash donations. Copies of such receipts shall be given to the donor and the original retained by Franklin's Promise.
- d. The monetary donations from the Wildfire shall be regularly accounted for by Franklin's Promise to Franklin County, at least every two weeks, with a minimum report consisting of a copy of the bank statement for the Special Account showing deposit of all donations received and all expenditures from the account mentioned in paragraph 2(a) and copies of receipts, as well as such other information as may be requested by Franklin County. This report shall be delivered to Michael Moron at 34 Forbes Street, Apalachicola, Florida or michael@franklincountyflorida.com. A copy of the bank statement shall be delivered to Michael Moron within five business days of the date that Franklin's Promise receives the bank statement for the Special Account.
- e. All donations for the Wildfire are subject to audit.
- f. One Hundred percent (100%) of the donations for the Wildfire shall be expended for the Wildfire recovery.
- g. No administrative fees or costs of any kind shall be deducted from any part of the donations for the Wildfire.
- h. Franklin County shall be the final decision maker on the expenditure of funds received by Franklin's Promise in trust as Franklin County's ESF15. All expenditures in excess of \$1,000.00 shall require the prior approval of Michael Moron, Franklin County's Coordinator. All expenditures below \$1,000.00, shall be made by Franklin County's Emergency Operation Center employees.
- 3. Each of the parties below is authorized to sign on behalf of their respective entity.

- 4. This agreement cannot be modified except in a subsequent writing signed by all parties.
- 5. If Franklin's Promise is no longer Franklin County's ESF15, designated as the agency to collect donations for the Wildfire, then the ownership of the Special Account shall be transferred either to Franklin County or a charitable organization selected by Franklin County within 30 calendar days written notice from Franklin County to Franklin's Promise. However, if Franklin's Promise is no longer Franklin County's ESF15, it shall continue to be bound by the terms of this contract for five years after the date that Franklin's Promise is no longer Franklin County's ESF15.
- 6. The ESF15 provisions of Franklin County's Emergency Management Plan are incorporated herein by this reference and are attached hereto as Exhibit "A." In the event of conflict, this contract controls.

I. Purpose

The purpose of Emergency Support Function 15 to coordinate the efficient and effective utilization of unaffiliated volunteers and donated resources to meet the needs of the impacted area(s) of Franklin County following a disaster or other incident of significance.

Overall management, coordination and prioritization of volunteer support and distribution of donated resources to meet the needs of the impacted area(s) following a disaster or other incident of significance.

The following policies apply:

- All unaffiliated volunteer activity will be coordinated by ESF-15.
- All unsolicited offers of donations will be routed to and/or coordinated by ESF-15.
- All requests for goods or services that can be provided through volunteers or donations will be coordinated by ESF-15.

The following assumptions will guide the implementation of ESF 15 in Franklin County:

- A significant natural or man-made catastrophic event will produce an overwhelming public response both locally and from outside of Franklin County.
- Type and location of damage sustained during the event will influence the amount and type of assistance required.
- Effective coordination of disaster response requests will be difficult during the immediate post-event time period due to damage or destruction of communication networks.
- Damage or destruction of transportation networks will slow response and delay arrival of volunteer and donations resources.
- It is impossible to have advance knowledge of the arrival of all donations.
- Numerous unaffiliated volunteers will arrive without prior coordination.
- An accurate inventory management system is essential to the effective and timely distribution of donated resources.

Determination of area of greatest need is based on completed need assessments conducted by teams and field reports compiled by ESF-5. The priority for delivery of goods is:

- (a) food
- (b) water
- (c) medical care
- (d) shelter
- (e) Distribution of public information regarding resources needed/not needed.
- (f) Maintenance of a complete data base to assure prompt allocation of available resources.
- (g) Assumption that resources will be needed during a major event for at least six months.


II. Concept of Operations

A. GENERAL

- 1. Emergency Support Function 15 is organized consistent with State Emergency Operations Center and the requirements of the National Response Plan, the National Incident Management System, and the Incident Command System in order to provide incident assessment, planning, procurement, deployment, coordination and support operations to Franklin County through the Franklin County Emergency Response Team, Area Operations and State Emergency Response Teams to assure a timely and appropriate response to an emergency or situation.
- 2. Procedures protocols and plans for disaster response activities are developed to govern staff operations at the Franklin Emergency Operations Center and in the field. These are in the form of Emergency Operations Plan (i.e., Base Plan) and corresponding Appendices, Incident Annexes, Support Annexes and Standard Operating Guidelines, which describe Emergency Support Function 15 capabilities (based on the National Planning Scenarios, the Universal Task List and the Target Capabilities). Periodic training and exercises are also conducted to enhance effectiveness.
- In a large event requiring local or State mutual aid assistance, Emergency Support Function 15 will work with its support agency counterparts to seek and procure, plan, coordinate and direct the use of any required assets.
- Throughout the response and recovery periods, Emergency Support Function 15 will evaluate and analyze information regarding the availability of volunteers and donated goods and services.
- 5. A Volunteer representative will fill a liaison role at the EOC to assist in coordination of all activities under ESF 15.
- 6. Request will be made of SEOC ESF 15 and ESF 2 to assist in establishing a 1-800 number with multi-line rollover capacity to be used for incoming volunteer and donations related calls placed from outside of Franklin County. Until established, utilize United Way main line. These lines will be located in the

warehouse/volunteer reception facility. UWEC Marketing Communications and Franklin County PIO will publicize the importance of outside callers using this line for instructions PRIOR to sending donations or arriving for volunteer assignment.

- Pre-designated warehouse space will be utilized by ESF-15 to receive, sort, inventory and redistribute donated goods to agencies and churches.
- 8. Volunteer coordinators will establish reception centers adjacent to donations warehouse facilities.
- 9. Prioritization of needs will be established following Rapid Impact Assessment Team report.

B. ORGANIZATION

1. COUNTY

a. During an activation of the County Emergency Operations Center, support agency staff is integrated with the Franklin County Emergency Management staff to provide support that will allow for an appropriate, coordinated and timely response.

- b. During an emergency or disaster event, the Emergency Operations Center, Operations Section Chief will coordinate the support resources from the support agencies with the Human Services Branch Chief.
- c. During the response phase, Emergency Support Function 15 will evaluate and analyze information regarding volunteers and donations requests. Also, Emergency Support Function 15 will develop and update assessments of the requirements for volunteers and donations in the impacted area and undertake contingency planning to meet anticipated demands and requirements.
- d. Staffing of ESF 15 positions will be accomplished through using resources of the Franklin County along with personnel from ESF 15 support agencies and trained and screened unaffiliated volunteers.
- e. Individual organizations supporting ESF 15 will maintain contact with the ESF 15 EOC liaison to advise of status and response capabilities.

2. AREA

- a. The Human Services Branch Chief, in consultation with the requesting jurisdiction, may obtain additional volunteer and donated goods management resources via established mutual aid agreements.
- b. The Florida Commission on Community Service serves as the lead agency for volunteers and donations coordination and support and will designate a liaison to the EOC from the Regional Office and/or the Regional Domestic Security Task Force (RDSTF). The liaisons have been trained to carry out Emergency Support Function 15 responsibilities and will function as coordinators, assessors, and operational personnel in support of EOC or field activities.
- c. If more than one County emergency management operation center is activated, State ESF 15 may support the coordination of the response with regional resources or request additional resources from the State Emergency Operations Center. Under such circumstances, the State ESF 15 agencies will participate in a Multi-Agency coordinating entity to coordinate requests for Volunteers and Donations resources among multiple Emergency Operations Centers.

3. STATE

- a. During an activation of the State Emergency Operations Center, the Florida Commission on Community Service is the designated lead agency for State volunteer and donations services and will provide a liaison to facilitate requests for ESF 15 resources to local Emergency Operations Centers.
- b. During an emergency or disaster event, the primary and support agencies of Emergency Support Function 15 at the State Emergency Operations Center will report to the Human Services Branch Chief who reports to the Operations Section Chief under the overall direction of the State Coordination Officer.

c. The Florida Commission on Community Service develops and maintains the overall Emergency Support Function 15 Emergency Operations Plan and accompanying Appendices, Annexes and Standard Operating Guidelines that govern response actions related to emergencies. However, support agencies may develop and maintain their own similar documents for internal use, which must be compatible with and in support of the overall Emergency Operations Plan. All such documents will be in compliance with the National Response Plan, the National Incident Management System, the Incident Command System and the County Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan.

C. ALERTS/NOTIFICATIONS

- The Franklin County Emergency Management will notify the County Warning Point when information comes to their attention indicating that an emergency or disaster situation is developing. The report will include all relevant information that is known at this time. Additional information should be reported as it becomes available.
- The County Warning Point, will notify the "on call" Emergency Duty Officer and/or Emergency Coordinating Officer (ECO) for Emergency Support Function when the County or an area of the County has been threatened or impacted by an emergency or disaster event as provided in the County Warning Point procedure.

D. ACTIONS

Actions carried out by Emergency Support Function 15 are grouped into phases of emergency management: prevention, preparedness, protection, response, recovery and mitigation. Each phase requires specific skills and knowledge to accomplish and requires significant cooperation and collaboration between all supporting agencies and the intended recipients of service. Emergency Support Function 15 encompasses a full range of activities from training to the provision of field services. It also functions as a coordinator and, at times, assumes direct operational control of provided services.

E. DIRECTION AND CONTROL

1. Emergency Support Function 15 complies with the National Response Plan, the National Incident Management System and uses the Incident Command System (composed of Planning, Operations, Logistics and Finance/Administration Sections with their standardized Units, Teams, positions, forms and terminology) to manage its emergency/disaster responsibilities. Key to this system is Emergency Management, which functions as the official disaster prevention, protection, response, preparedness, recovery, and mitigation organization within Franklin County. It is responsible for ensuring that all appropriate program departments, support agencies, other Emergency Support Functions and other private voluntary agencies have knowledge about the system and Emergency Support Function 15 expectations, as well as coordinate and cooperate efficiently during an event.

The Emergency Support Function 15 system operates in two arenas; 1) The county Emergency Operations Center; 2) field locations.

F. RESPONSIBILITIES

1. PRIMARY AGENCY - FRANKLINS PROMISE COALITION

Activate the ESF-15 liaison for duty at the EOC.

- Notify all support agencies for assessment, activation and mobilization purposes.
- Coordinate with other ESFs to determine available resources and needs.
- Organize and provide lead staff for all facilities directly related to ESF-15 purpose.
- Coordinate disbursement of donated goods to agencies in need.

2. SUPPORT AGENCIES

- Provide personnel and resources to staff operations supportive of ESF-15 purpose.
- b. Notify and mobilize personnel as directed by ESF-15 representative.
- Maintain regular communication with ESF-15 representative at the EOC.
- Maintain records of personnel, funds and time expended in support of directed operations.
- e. Provide names and contact information of all tasked personnel to the ESF-15 representative.

G. FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

- 1. Emergency Support Function 15 is responsible for managing financial matters related to resources that are procured and used during an event. During a response, each agency/department is responsible for recording and tracking its own expenditures and seeking reimbursement from the appropriate resource after the event. If a federally declared disaster exists, then a reimbursement formula is established by the Federal Emergency Management Agency that may be as much as 100 percent, but usually does not exceed 75 percent.
- 2. This section will coordinate closely with the Logistics Section to ensure that procurements and staff hours are properly documented and processed for payment and potential reimbursement. It will also be responsible for following up all financial issues after response has ceased by coordinating with Emergency Management fiscal and personnel management officials, the State Division of Emergency Management fiscal agents and the Federal Emergency management Agency fiscal agents and directly with vendors as necessary.

 Expenditures by support entities will be documented by those entities and submitted directly to the Finance/Administration Section or a designated Finance Service officer as soon as possible.



ORDER APPROVING LIMITED PROCEEDING TO INCLUDE IN BASE RATES THE REVENUE REQUIREMENT FOR THE CITRUS COMBINED CYCLE PROJECT

BY THE COMMISSION:

Background

On May 27, 2014, Duke Energy Florida, LLC (DEF) filed a petition for a determination of need for the Citrus County Combined Cycle Power Plant Project (Citrus Combined Cycle Project). DEF plans to complete construction of the 1,640-megawatt, two-unit plant on a site adjacent to its Crystal River Energy Center in Citrus County, Florida, by December 2018. We granted DEF's determination of need for the Citrus Combined Cycle Project by Order No. PSC-14-0557-FOF-EI. In that proceeding, we found that the Citrus Combined Cycle Project, at an estimated construction cost of approximately \$1.514 billion, represented the optimal resource option to meet DEF's projected generation need.

On August 29, 2017, DEF filed a petition for a limited proceeding to approve its 2017 Second Revised and Restated Settlement Agreement (2017 Settlement). The 2017 Settlement was signed and executed by DEF, the Office of Public Counsel, the Florida Industrial Power Users Group, the Florida Retail Federation, White Springs Agricultural Chemicals, Inc. (d/b/a PCS Phosphate), and the Southern Alliance for Clean Energy. The signatories to the 2017 Settlement are organizations that represent DEF's major customer groups. We approved the 2017 Settlement on November 20, 2017, by Order No. PSC-2017-0451-AS-EU.²

If DEF constructs and places in service the Citrus Combined Cycle Project in 2018, Paragraph 14(a) of the 2017 Settlement provides a base rate increase referred to as the 2018 Generation Base Rate Adjustment (GBRA). As required under Paragraph 14(a) of the 2017 Settlement, DEF's initial 2018 GBRA for the Citrus Combined Cycle Project must reflect the costs used to support the need determination case.

On April 2, 2018, DEF filed the instant petition for a limited proceeding for approval to include in base rates the revenue requirement for the Citrus Combined Cycle Project. The project is expected to be placed in service in two phases: September 2018 and November 2018. Phase 1 will include the construction of Unit 1 and the associated transmission/common equipment. Phase 2 will include the construction of Unit 2. DEF has requested that we approve the estimated revenue requirement of \$200,488,588 for the entire GBRA and approve the necessary tariffs to reflect the change in base rates in October 2018 and December 2018.

DEF waived the 60-day file and suspend provision of Section 366.06(3), Florida Statutes (F.S.). We have jurisdiction pursuant to Section 366.06 and 366.076, F.S.

Decision

Petition to include in base rates the revenue requirement for the Citrus Combined Cycle Project

DEF stated in its petition that the Citrus Combined Cycle Project will be placed in service in two phases: September 2018 and November 2018. DEF requested that we approve the revenue requirement necessary for the rate increase in both phases, with an estimated retail revenue requirement totaling \$200,488,588.

As discussed in the background, this Commission evaluated the estimated cost for the Citrus Combined Cycle Project in the need determination, and the GBRA cost recovery method was set forth in the 2017 Settlement. Our review of DEF's cost estimate and revenue requirement calculations are discussed below along with the rate impact.

Cost Estimate

Based upon Exhibit B, which DEF attached to its petition, the total operating expenses for Unit 1, Unit 2, and transmission/common equipment are \$53,006,000, \$38,811,000, and \$2,406,000, respectively, for the first year. These costs include operating and maintenance (O&M), depreciation, property insurance, and property tax. DEF affirmed that these costs are the same as those used by DEF to support its need determination case, consistent with the requirement under Paragraph 14(a) of the 2017 Settlement.³

The estimated capital cost of approximately \$1.514 billion is the same as in the need determination. DEF stated that while this is a reasonable and accurate projection, there are a variety of events that can impact the schedule and cost of the overall project. These may include skilled labor and supply availability, severe weather events, and other force majeure events.⁴

Paragraph 14(d) of DEF's 2017 Settlement addresses the circumstance in which DEF's actual capital cost is lower than the projected cost used to develop the initial 2018 GBRA factor. Under this circumstance, the lower actual cost will be the basis for the full revenue requirements and a one-time credit is required to be made through the Capacity Cost Recovery Clause. In addition, Paragraph 14(e) addresses the situation in which DEF's actual capital cost is higher than the projected cost used to develop the initial 2018 GBRA factor. Under this circumstance, DEF may, at its option, initiate a limited proceeding to seek to increase the 2018 GBRA factor by the corresponding incremental revenue requirement. We find that these measures protect customers against unwarranted cost increases over the cost used in the need determination case.

Revenue Requirement Calculation

Based on the estimated cost of the project and the commercial in-service dates for the two phases as described above, DEF calculated a revenue requirement of \$200,488,588 for the entire GBRA. DEF estimated the revenue requirement for Phase 1 to be \$123,180,439 and \$77,308,149 for Phase 2. In accordance with Paragraph 14(c) of the 2017 Settlement, DEF utilized its projected 13-month average capital structure for the first 12 months of operation, and a 10.50 percent return on equity to calculate the revenue requirement. The revenue requirement calculation also included the recovery of O&M expenses, depreciation expense, property insurance, property tax, and income tax. We verified the revenue requirement of \$200,488,588 based on the capital structure provided by DEF, which reflected a projected 13-month average capital structure for the first 12 months of operation. We find that \$200,488,588 is the appropriate revenue requirement based on the 2017 Settlement.

Conclusion

Consistent with the 2017 Settlement, DEF's 2018 GBRA for the Citrus Combined Cycle Project reflects the costs pursuant to which the need determination was granted. Therefore, we approve DEF's petition.

Approval of proposed tariffs and associated charges needed to implement the two phases of the Citrus Combined Cycle Project

As discussed in above, we approve a revenue requirement totaling \$200,488,588 for both phases of the Citrus Combined Cycle Project. Consistent with Paragraph 14(b) of DEF's 2017 Settlement, and as shown in Exhibit C of the petition, the requested total amount shall be applied as a uniform percentage to all rate classes at 6.88 percent for Phase 1 and at 4.04 percent for Phase 2. At these uniform percentage rates, a residential customer using 1,000 kWh per month will see a bill increase of \$3.59 for Phase 1 and \$2.25 for Phase 2. The combined base rate increase of \$5.84 on a 1,000 kWh bill is \$0.71 lower than the estimated increase stated in Docket No. 20140110-EI.

Customer Notification

DEF stated that it will notify its customers of the rate changes via bill inserts in their August 2018 bill for Phase 1, and via bill inserts in their October 2018 bill for Phase 2.⁵ Electronic bill customers will receive a link to the bill insert via email. The bill insert will also be posted on DEF's website.

Conclusion

We grant Commission staff the administrative authority to approve tariffs and associated charges that implement our approval regarding base rate inclusion of DEF's Citrus Combined Cycle Project, which will be placed in service in two phases. The tariffs and associated charges for Phase 1 shall go into effect with the first billing cycle in October 2018, and the tariffs and associated charges for Phase 2 of the Citrus Combined Cycle Project shall go into effect with the first billing cycle in December 2018. If the commercial in-service date of Phase 1 of the project is delayed, the tariff shall become effective with the first billing cycle after Phase 1 is completed and placed in commercial service. If Phase 2 is delayed, the tariff shall become effective with the first billing cycle after Phase 2 is completed and placed in commercial service. If this Order is protested, DEF shall implement the rates subject to refund pending the results of any subsequent hearing.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Duke Energy Florida, LLC's (DEF) 2018 GBRA for the Citrus Combined Cycle Project reflects, consistent with the 2017 Settlement, the costs pursuant to which the need determination was granted. We therefore approve inclusion in base rates the revenue requirement for the Citrus Combined Cycle Project. It is further

ORDERED that Commission staff is granted the administrative authority to approve tariffs and associated charges that implement our vote regarding the Citrus Combined Cycle Project, which will be placed in service in two phases. The tariffs and associated charges for Phase 1 shall go into effect with the first billing cycle in October 2018, and the tariffs and associated charges for Phase 2 of the Citrus Combined Cycle Project shall go into effect with the first billing cycle in December 2018. If the commercial in-service date of Phase 1 of the project

is delayed, the tariff shall become effective with the first billing cycle after Phase 1 is completed and placed in commercial service. If Phase 2 is delayed, the tariff shall become effective with the first billing cycle after Phase 2 is completed and placed in commercial service. If this Order is protested, DEF shall implement the rates subject to refund pending the results of any subsequent hearing. It is further,

ORDERED that if no timely protest is filed, this docket shall be closed upon the issuance of a consummating order. If a protest is filed within 21 days of the issuance of this order, the tariff shall remain in effect, with any revenues held subject to refund, pending resolution of the protest.

ORDER APPROVING PETITION TO MODIFY GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING ELECTRIC SERVICE, BILLING, RESIDENTIAL AND NON-RESIDENTIAL BUDGET BILLING

BY THE COMMISSION:

Background

On May 23, 2018, Duke Energy Florida, LLC (DEF) filed a petition to offer budget billing to commercial customers. The proposed budget billing tariff sheets Nos. 4.086 and 4.087 are shown in Attachment A.¹

Currently, the five Florida investor-owned electric utilities offer optional budget billing for residential customers. We have approved budget billing for commercial customers for Florida Power & Light Company² and Gulf Power Company.³ We have jurisdiction under Sections 366.04, 366.05, and 366.06, Florida Statutes (F.S.).

Decision

Currently, budget billing is only offered to residential customers. DEF has proposed to extend the budget billing option to the commercial General Service -1 (GS-1) and General

Service Demand – 1 (GSD-1) class customers. DEF states in its petition that it can provide better customer service by extending the budget billing to commercial customers without affecting the general body of ratepayers.

Budget billing is an optional program that allows customers to reduce the variations in monthly bills that result from seasonal fluctuations in the usage of electricity. This leveling of the bill allows customers to more easily budget their electricity expenses. The methodology for determining the monthly budget bill for commercial customers will be the same as the methodology for determining the monthly budget bill for residential customers. The customer is billed based upon an average of their last 12 months' kilowatt-hour (kWh) usage, rather than for their actual monthly usage.

The amount billed using the average method is subtracted from the amount which would have been billed based on actual usage. This difference is credited to a deferred balance account which maintains a running total of overcollection and undercollection. DEF recalculates the monthly budget billing amount every third month using the most recent 12 months' billings plus any deferred balances. If the difference between the current and the newly calculated monthly budget billing amount is greater than 10 percent, the monthly budget billing amount will be reestablished.

Customers may request termination of the budget billing at any time. Upon termination of the plan or disconnection of service, the customer must settle the account in full. Once the customer has been terminated, the customer may not rejoin the plan for 12 months.

The residential budget billing tariff provision is currently included on residential tariff sheet No. 6.121. DEF proposed to include the residential budget billing tariff provision, together with the proposed commercial budget billing provision, in its general rules and regulations section of its tariff, as shown in Attachment A.

Conclusion

We have reviewed DEF's petition for approval of its budget billing for its commercial customers and determined that participation in the program is optional and will provide DEF's commercial customers with benefits of budget billing that are currently available to its residential customers. Therefore, we approve DEF's petition for approval of budget billing for commercial customers, effective on July 10, 2018.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Duke Energy Florida LLC's petition for approval of budget billing for commercial customers is approved and the proposed tariffs shall become effective on July 10, 2018.

ORDERED that if a protest is filed within 21 days of issuance of the Order, the tariff shall remain in effect with any charges held subject to refund pending resolution of the protest. It is further

ORDERED that if no timely protest is filed, this docket shall be closed upon the issuance of a Consummating Order.

8.09 Budget Billing Plan (Optional):

Residential

A customer may elect to be billed for service hereunder by an alternative-billing plan called the "Budget Billing Plan." This billing plan provides for payments on an averaged monthly installment basis rather than payments on an actual monthly usage basis.

Under the Budget Billing Plan, the monthly billing is determined as follows:

- 1. The Annual Base Amount is calculated using the most recent twelve (12) months' billings for the premise and then averaged and rounded to the nearest whole dollar (Monthly Budget Billing Amount). If the customer has not resided at the premise for twelve (12) months, the Annual Base Amount will be determined by the customer's available monthly billings plus the previous occupant's billings. If the premise is new, a twelve (12) month estimated billing would be used.
- The Monthly Budget Billing Amount is recalculated every third month using the most recent Annual Base Amount plus any deferred balances (the difference in prior billings made under the Budget Billing Plan and that of actual charges).

Monthly Budget Billing Amount = 12 Month Summation Actual or Est. Annual Base Balance

If the difference between the newly calculated Monthly Budget Billing Amount and the current Monthly Budget Billing Amount is greater than \$5 or 10%, then the Monthly Billing Amount will be re-established at the newly calculated amount (rounded to the nearest whole dollar).

 At the customer's option (in lieu of carrying the deferred balance forward in the recalculation of the Monthly Budget Billing Amount) any deferred balance that is outstanding at the customer's annual review may be settled either through being applied to the customer's next bill (if a credit balance) or direct payment to the Company (if a debit balance)

A customer may request termination of the Budget Billing Plan at any time. The Company may terminate application of the Plan to any Customer whose balance due becomes sixty (60) days delinquent. Upon termination of the Plan or disconnection of service, the Customer must settle the account in full. Once the Customer has terminated, he or she may not rejoin the plan for twelve (12) months.

Non-residential

Any GS-1 or GSD-1 Customer who has

- no delinquent balances;
- has been at the same location for 12 consecutive months with the Company;
- not had more than one (1) late payment notice during the preceding 12 months;
- · not made a payment with a dishonored check during the preceding 12 months;
- not had a disconnection of service for nonpayment of bill during preceding 12 months;
- · the total required deposit; and
- · met the Company's requirements for the establishment of credit

is eligible to participate in the Budget Billing Plan described below for GS-1 and GSD-1 rate billings. However, GS-1 or GSD-1 Customers that participate in the Premier Power Service Rider and/or Summary Billing will not be eligible to participate in this Budget Billing Plan. A Customer may terminate participation in the Budget Billing Plan at any time and may be terminated from the Budget Billing Plan by Duke Energy Florida, LLC if the Customer becomes subject to collection action on this service account. Once a Customer's participation in the Budget Billing Plan has terminated he/she may not rejoin the Budget Billing Plan for twelve (12) months following the date of termination.

This billing plan provides for payments on an averaged monthly installment basis rather than payments on an actual monthly usage basis.

Under the Budget Billing Plan, the monthly billing is determined as follows:

- The Annual Base Amount is calculated using the most recent twelve (12) months' billings for the premise and then averaged and rounded to the nearest whole dollar (Monthly Budget Billing Amount).
- The Monthly Budget Billing Amount is recalculated every third month using the most recent Annual Base Amount plus any deferred balances (the difference in prior billings made under the Budget Billing Plan and that of actual charges).

If the difference between the newly calculated Monthly Budget Billing Amount and the current Monthly Budget Billing Amount is greater than 10% then the Monthly Billing Amount will be re-established at the newly calculated amount (rounded to the nearest whole dollar).

 At the customer's option (in lieu of carrying the deferred balance forward in the recalculation of the Monthly Budget Billing Amount) any deferred balance that is outstanding at the customer's annual review may be settled either through being applied to the customer's next bill (if a credit balance) or direct payment to the Company (if a debit balance).

A customer may request termination of the Budget Billing Plan at any time. The Company may terminate application of the Plan to any Customer whose balance due becomes fourteen (14) calendar days delinquent. Termination of any one account for delinquency may subject all other Customer's participating accounts to termination of the plan. Upon termination of the Plan or disconnection of service, the Customer must settle the account in full. Once the Customer has terminated, he or she may not rejoin the plan for twelve (12) months.
