

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF FRANKLIN, STATE OF FLORIDA, REQUIRING THAT ALL DOGS BE INOCULATED AGAINST RABIES.

ORDINANCE # 76-1
FRANKLIN COUNTY, FLORIDA

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY, FLORIDA:

It is necessary in order to promote the health, safety and welfare of the people of Franklin County, Florida, that this ordinance be adopted.

It is therefore ordained by the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Florida, that all dogs in Franklin County, Florida must be inoculated against rabies.

It is further ordained that all dogs in Franklin County, Florida shall wear a tag showing current veterinary certification that such animal has been so inoculated.

Every dog shall be inoculated against rabies at six months of age, and at least every 12 months thereafter. Should public health authorities declare it necessary inoculation shall be made at three months of age.

The owner of any dog found at large without such inoculation and tag, shall be fined \$25.00 for each occurrence, and such occurrence shall be a misdemeanor, punishable according to law.

This ordinance adopted in open session this 2nd day of March 1976, after notice of intent to consider such ordinance has been made and kept in the ordinance book of the Board for at least 15 days exclusive of Sundays and legal holidays, and the title and substance hereof published according to law in a newspaper of general circulation within the County.

This ordinance shall take effect when notice of receipt of a certified copy of same is returned from the Secretary of State.
