ORDINANCE NO. 92- 4

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE FRANKLIN
COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, Franklin County Ordinance 88-4, the Franklin County Animal Control Ordinance, refers to the Franklin County Animal Control Authority, and

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Board of County Commissioners now finds it advisable and appropriate to establish and provide authority for the Franklin County Animal Control Authority,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FRANKLIN COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS:

1. There is hereby established the Franklin County Animal Control Authority.

2. The Franklin County Animal Control Authority shall have the authority and power to enforce the Franklin County Animal Control Ordinance, as enacted and as it may be amended from time to time.

3. The Franklin County Animal control Authority shall not spend or commit to spend any County public moneys, except those budgeted and appropriated by the Franklin County Board of County Commissioners, but shall keep and expend as its funds all fees collected by it, and all gifts and appropriations if may lawfully receive from other sources.

4. The Franklin County Animal Control Authority shall have five members, who shall be:

a. A member of the Franklin County board of County Commissioners, who shall be EDWARD TOLLIVER initially;

b. A member of the governing body of the City of Apalachicola, who shall be EDITH EDWARDS initially;

c. A member of the governing body of the City of Carrabelle, who shall be MARIE GRAY initially;

d. A member of the Franklin County Humane Society, Inc. who shall be JANE COX initially, and

e. An officer or employee of the Franklin County Sheriff's Department, who shall be ARCHIE HOLTON initially.

5. The terms of the initial appointees shall be from the effective date of this Ordinance until 12:00 P.M. December 31, 1993, and thereafter until their successors are appointed. Thereafter, members terms shall be for four years. Provided, however a member must represent the category the member was appointed to represent, and the Franklin County Board of County Commissioners shall declare a member's term vacant should a member cease to represent the category.

6. Membership vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the governing bodies of the foregoing local government and the Franklin County Humane Society, Inc. and by the Sheriff of Franklin County.

This Ordinance adopted in open regular meeting this 5th day of May, 1992, after notice of intent to consider same has been made and kept in the Ordinance Book of the Clerk of the Board for at least fifteen (15) days, exclusive of Sundays and legal holidays, and the title and substance hereof published according to law in the Apalachicola Times, a newspaper of general circulation within the County.

This Ordinance shall take effect when notice of a receipt of a certified copy of same is returned from the Secretary of State.
