

ORDINANCE 2022- 22
FRANKLIN COUNTY, FLORIDA

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FRANKLIN COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO ADOPT A POLICY IN THE COASTAL CONSERVATION ELEMENT RELATING TO THE PERILS OF FLOOD, AS REQUIRED BY CHAPTER 163.3178(2)(f), FLORIDA STATUTES.

WHEREAS, Franklin County is required by Chapter 163.3178(2)(f), Florida Statutes, to amend its Comprehensive Plan to include language about the perils of flood, and

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Planning and Zoning Commission has recommended adoption of language in the Franklin County Comprehensive Plan, and

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Board of County Commissioners has held a public hearing to consider adopting this amendment,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FRANKLIN COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS that the following Policy of the Coastal Conservation Element of the Franklin County Comprehensive Plan, is adopted:


POLICY 16.5 Franklin County will continue to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program's Community Rating System and will take all reasonable steps to improve the County's rating in the Community Rating System.

Any other ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are herewith repealed.

The effective date of this plan amendment, if the amendment is not timely challenged, shall be 31 days after the state land planning agency notifies the local government that the plan amendment package is complete. If the amendment is timely challenged, this amendment shall become effective on the date the state land planning agency or the Administration Commission enters a final order determining this adopted amendment to be in compliance.

This ordinance adopted this 6th day of December 2022, in a regular meeting of the Franklin County Board of County Commissioners.
