

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING FRANKLIN COUNTY ORDINANCE 72-2
AND THE OCCUPATIONAL ICENSE TAX THEREBY IMPOSED IN
FRANKLIN COUNTY, FLORIDA.

ORDINANCE NO. 86-8

FRANKLIN COUNTY, FLORIDA

WHEREAS, Franklin County Ordinance 72-2 imposes an
Occupational License Tax throughout Franklin County, Florida,
pursuant to Chapter 72-306, General laws of Florida, and

WHEREAS, said tax is unnecessary and burdensome to the
people, and

WHEREAS, said tax does not produce significant revenue for
the County, but is expensive and burdensome to administer,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY, FLORIDA, that Franklin
County Ordinance 72-2, and the Occupational License Tax thereby
imposed are hereby repealed.

THIS ORDINANCE adopted in open regular session this
7th day of October, 1986, after such notice of intent to
consider such an ordinance has been made and kept in the
Ordinance Book of the Clerk of this Board for at least 15
day exclusive of Sundays and legal holidays, and the title and
substance hereof published according to law in the Apalachicola
Times, a newspaper of general circulation within the County.
